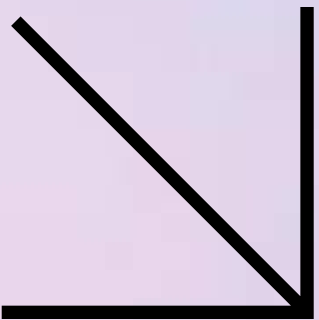

Rethinking Research Methods

EPISTEMOLOGIES, METRICS, AND INSTITUTIONAL ECOLOGIES OF ARTISTIC RESEARCH

This session explores how Artistic Research (AR) generates knowledge –poetically, conceptually, and institutionally –while experimenting with new modes of evaluation and mapping. It encompasses a case study on INAR’s poetic/conceptual inquiry, an Italian digital cartography of AR, proposals to integrate “impact” into assessment, media historical accounts of “tacit games” as method, a performance lecture on the conflation of AR across university and artworld frameworks, and a cross sectoral perspective that interweaves art, science, and community.

Art, Media, and Technology

HYBRID INFRASTRUCTURES, PERFORMATIVE MACHINES, AND POST DIGITAL STAGES

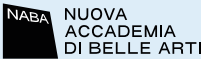
Focusing on the medial conditions of research, these contributions interweave “old” and “new” media, articulate cybernetics as an epistemic matrix for media art, and stage machinic masks as performative agents. Theatre migrates to virtual worlds, the “elusive image” invites phenomenological inquiry, and simulated hybrid environments serve as controlled settings for testing practice based Artistic Research.

Mediterranean Ecologies and Situated Perspectives

PLURIVERSAL SHORES, TRANSNATIONAL NETWORKS, FEMINIST PERSPECTIVES
AND LOGISTICS OF CULTURE

Framing the Mediterranean as a living research milieu, this session foregrounds shoreline ecologies, feminist epistemologies rooted in embodied knowledge and action, and infrastructural circuits that link artisanal gestures to digital forms across Europe. It culminates in proposals for a transnational Mediterranean art network that reimagines creativity through mobility and exchange.



AI: Mapping Tools and Critical Deconstruction

ALGORITHMS, ARCHIVES, AND THE POLITICS OF COMPUTATION

In this session, AI is positioned both as a method and as an object of critique: from the fantasy space of democratic spectacle, to fabulatory engagements with architectural archives, and practices of “unlearning” algorithmic intelligence. The track also examines platform-based tools in higher arts education and frames AI as a site of tactical resistance and artistic politics.

AI and Emergent Practices

IMPROVISATION, POSTHUMAN MUSICIANSHIP, AND SEMANTIC CO-PRODUCTION

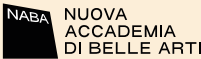
Positioning AI as a collaborator, these papers outline posthuman frameworks for experimental music, the creation of digital doubles in mixed music, and improvisation with AI as a generator of the *unexpected*. They further probe how AI’s “universal memory paths” can revitalize waste and scrap materials beyond trend-driven aesthetics, and how artistic engagements with text-to-image models co-produce meaning.

Exhibiting and Distributing Artistic Research

VISUALIZATION, ONLINE ARCHIVES, AND RESEARCH JUSTICE

This session examines how Artistic Research is made public: visualizing research across diverse configurations, rethinking the inhabitation of archives and online exhibitions, retracing modes of display from the Wunderkammer to the database, and reclaiming DIY-zine cultures as practices of research justice and counter-distribution.

New Ecologies in Artistic Research

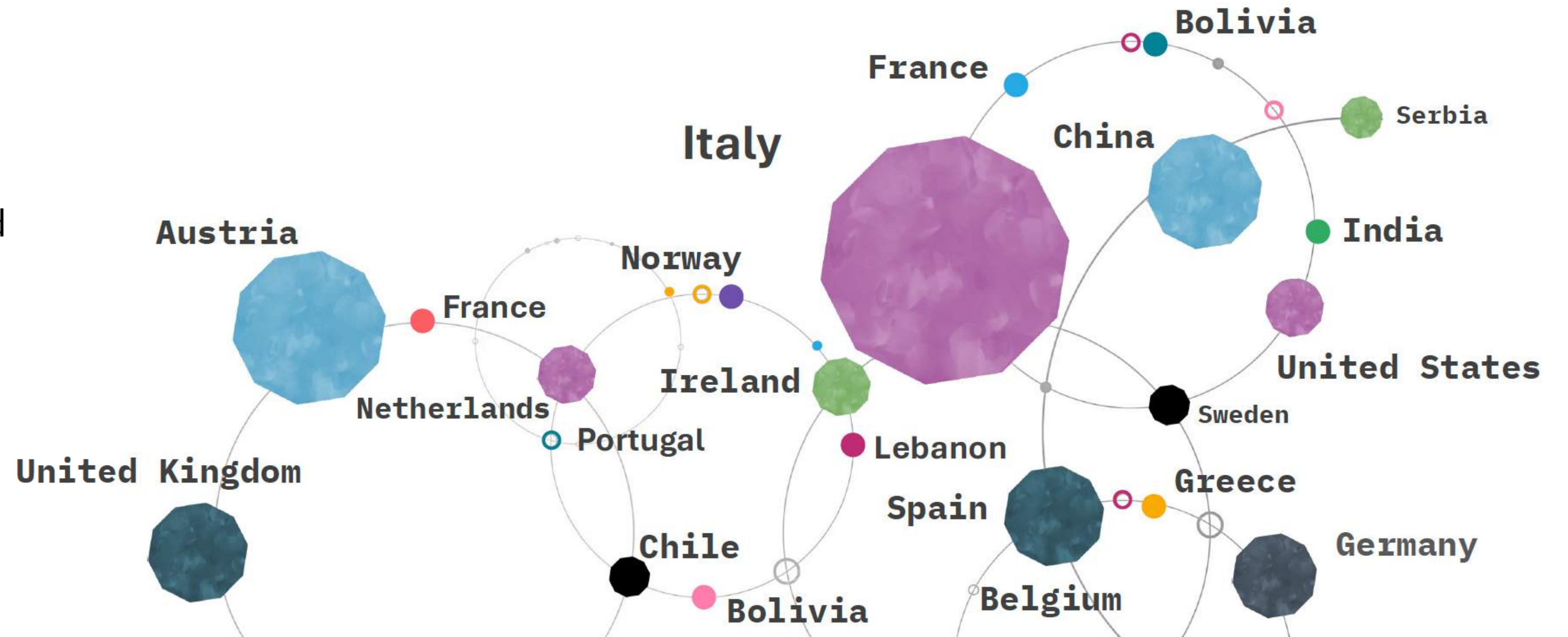
SOLAR DRAWING, MORE THAN HUMAN SENSING, AND PLATFORM WORLDS

Centering ecological imaginaries and posthuman perception, this track explores architectural drawing with the sun and the move “beyond the soundscape” toward posthuman ecologies. It also examines post digital memory and recognition, bioacoustic sonology as a tool for ecological perception, and resistance in the platform age framed as *digital neomedievalism*.

After an accurate double-blind peer-reviewed process we present **35 academic papers** and **21 PhD posters selected** for the three-day programme featuring **panels, keynote speakers, round tables, a PhD Forum** and **artistic contributions**.

The initiative engages the six disciplinary clusters of the Artistic Italian higher education system: Design, Visual Arts, Music, Cinema, Theatre/Performing Arts, Technology.

“ The *PhD Forum* aims to create a network of researchers from diverse backgrounds – including visual and performing arts, film, music and sound, and cultural studies – fostering the exchange of cultural formations, practices, intellectual geographies and research interests.

The forum aspires to be an extraordinary place for debating **doctoral research across disciplines and approaches**, a place where voices, challenges and projects are transformed into concrete initiatives capable of shaping the landscape of contemporary artistic and cultural research.
